INTERNATIONAL CUP HISTORY: In 1950 the Mosman Golf Club closed and donated this cup to the NSWLGU. In 1958 the VWGA asked the NSWLGU if they could secure the cup and rename it the 'International Cup'. Its purpose was to raise money for the International Fund run by the NSWLGU. The cup was to be played for annually and open to all VWGA members. The first event was held at Concord Golf Cub in August 1958. It raised 35 Pounds, and this was sent to the ALGU Treasurer in Melbourne for the International Fund. In April 1959, a small presentation (initialled handkerchiefs) was made to an Australian Ladies Team going abroad. The prizes for winning the annual event varied from International Spoons, purchased from the LGU, to open orders, to cake fork and spoon sets. I am not sure when the donations from the yearly event stopped but up to 1974 an amount of between \$100.00 - \$200.00 was sent to the ALGU.

UPDATES: Our 70th Anniversary Tournament at Manly which had been rescheduled from 2020 was cancelled due to unplayable course conditions. Entries to our first country tournament at Kurri Kurri (May) exceeded expectations and closed as soon as it was listed on our website. Penrith (22/4) have 108 ladies entered and will be reported in the next issue. Hopefully this theme continues and I'll catch up with you either at Penrith or at Woolooware on 4th June.
